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City Hall November 18, 2024

The Rossville City Council meeting was called to order on Monday, November 18, 2024 at 6:00 pm by Council President Trish Heim.

Motion by Rick Towers to approve minutes of the November 4, 2024 meeting as presented was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$39,421.13 was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Motion by Rick Towers to approve the agenda with addition of Patti Kirk and easement change request and moving sidewalk removal earlier on the agenda was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Kenny Titus was present to introduce himself to the governing body as the newly elected District 18 State Senator.

Levi Kiser presented plans for construction of ag seed and chemical storage facility in the Rossville Industrial Park and requested that council assign appropriate zoning to said location. Council noted that adjacent businesses are zoned "I-1" Light Industrial- "I-2" General Industrial. Following discussion motion by Todd Reeves to approve Industrial zoning for industrial park lot owned by Levi Kiser was seconded by Vernon Sumner and carried.

Willard City Clerk Barbara Cummings was present at request of Rossville Mayor James Meyer as the City of Rossville is reviewing the law enforcement and court service agreements and would be proposing some changes. Barbara Cummings to present information to the Willard City Council to determine if they would like to continue agreement with the City of Rossville.

Patti Kirk treasurer of the Rossville Community Development Committee noted that the Christmas festival would be December 7, 2024 and requested that the city provide road barricades for the parade. Council agreed to provide barricades and Chief Sipp to provide assistance if needed.

Amy and Tim Hersh were present to request permission to remove broken sidewalk on north side of property (Edna Street) at 202 Navarre Street. Following discussion motion by Dan Glotzbach to allow sidewalk to be removed was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Utility Superintendent Alan Zlatnik reported that he was getting bids for new mower. Clerk noted that there was app \$16,200.00 remaining in the park budget for possible purchase of mower.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported that he had ordered VIN reader; that he had rechecked 35 of the 45-plus 10 day nuisance abatement notices that had been issued; that he had reached out to KDOT again regarding the highway 24 crosswalk grant; that they had received the body camera's from Axon and will schedule installation and training when the rest of the equipment for the vehicles arrives; that he is checking with Kelsey of St Mary's Computers about contracting as IT person; that he had received complaint about vehicles parking in the 600 block of Pearl Street making street impassable and that he has increased monitoring of crosswalks and school zones and well as running radar on the North end of town. Council had discussion and requested that property owner's/residents in the area be contacted to inquire if they would be in favor of making the west side of 600 Pearl Street a no parking zone. Council also inquired about truck parked on west side of Navarre Street and Highway 24.

Council confirmed date, time and location for City holiday dinner.

Request to make changes to easement by adding gravel to both sides of existing driveway at 508 Spruce Street was presented. Motion by Rick Towers to approve request was seconded by Dan Glotzbach and carried.

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to adjourn was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:39 pm.
