City Hall October 21, 2024

Motion by Dan Glotzbach to pay bills as presented totaling \$35,483.03 was seconded by Rick Towers and carried.

Motion by Trish Heim to approve the agenda with addition of Jim Clancy was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried.

Jim Clancy was present to report on plans to spilt lot in Rossville Industrial Park and noted that all zoning regulations were in compliance. Council reviewed survey and had no issues with proposed splitting of lot.

Police Chief Thomas Sipp reported that Officer Hammer with assistance of Silver Lake Captain Nelson took care of traffic control for homecoming parade. In addition Chief Sipp noted that he had assisted Silver Lake during their homecoming parade, worked the homecoming football game and assisted grade school students when crossing road for homecoming activities.

Chief Sipp also reported that he would begin issuing 10-day abatement notices for inoperable vehicles tomorrow, that the new radar unit would be installed and certified in the new Tahoe tomorrow, that he had not heard any new information from KDOT on new crosswalk signs; he had assisted Desiree Wright at high school with investigation and interview, trial was set for clean up issues at 321 Navarre, that license plate readers were too old to update but Sheriff Hill was checking on possible options and that he had been asked to bring police vehicle to Rossville Christian Church yesterday for fall festival.

Chief Sipp presented September and year to date incident report.

Council discussed weeds at 515 Main. Chief Sipp to contact property owner.

Council asked if part time officers hours worked had increased. Chief Sipp noted that officers had responded to email about increasing number of hours worked.

Clerk reported that complaint had been received in City Hall regarding the increase in pay water rates that went into effect this month.

Mayor reported that he had contacted grain elevator owner regarding possible removal. Owner indicated that he is unable to remove at this time due to the cost of removing the concrete as required by the railroad. Mayor has contacted City Attorney to contact railroad regarding these requirements and to address the rough crossings.

Chief Sipp inquired about semi's parking along highway at Casey's and the no parking signs along Highway 24 by Miller's Auto.

Motion by Trish Heim to adjourn was seconded by Todd Reeves and carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:29 p.m.
